1.	Call to Order/Approve March Minutes	 Meeting called to order at 1:06 p.m. March minutes passed unanimously
2.	Guest Speaker: Dr. Albert	 DEI Implementation Plan: 17 projects, how do we get alignment with all the colleges and unit DEI officers, making sure we have top faculty and help them with their scholarship and working on employee retention and recruitment efforts She will send invite to our group for the Women's Leadership Group meeting V. Emerson: How does the university define diversity? Dr. Albert states that it is demographics, how we create a culture of belonging, geographic understanding of being a global university, different religions, etc. K. Moore: do you have a message that the elections committee could share with staff that would help with recruiting senators? Dr. Albert states that she does and she will connect with her offline R. Gardner: Who handles diversity and inclusion issues with the healthcare section of the enterprise? Dr. Albert says it is Dr.Talbert (Chief Diversity Officer) and Dr. Stephanie White is a lead in the College of Medicine S. President's Report	 COVID: down to only a couple student cases and no employee cases, 92.2% vaccination rates, masking is still required in classrooms and in healthcare Legislation sessions: he thanked all of the senators for their hard work and it is because of them that we get things moving with our legistatures. \$250 million dollar health education building, \$200 million in asset preservation. The Deans are being asked to raise 30% of their project cost. Communications on compensation and benefits: 42% of our employees will not see a rise in costs in their health insurance. Services are expanding 17 million dollars this year will be pushed out to managers to invest in our people. That is double from previous years. Theme of the April board meeting is "Our People" A. Eads: Where are we on Dean's Searches and Provost? E. Monday: We will get an email today on provost search. There will be a campus forum and will begin soon. Vice President for Philanthropy is closed and ended. We could not get to a pool that is a commitment of this institution. Will begin again this summer. Kostrub: When will information on healthcare benefits come out? R. Amos said very soon but he does not have the date K. Hahn: What is the latest on the work location group? O. Ellis said C. Gurtcheff and R. Story are the two senators on that work group. E. Monday: panel is in place and they are working. More comprehensive report will come in June C. Owens: is the staff pay increases funded by the state this year but next year departments will have to determine how to allocate funds to support the employees raises internally? E. Monday: our plan for the next four years is to fund them centrally where there would be no required match J. Br
