	 These teams – including IT, crisis communications, health care, athletics, student success, and more – prepare, evaluate, and improve their processes and protocols throughout the year Ongoing Investments Since 2012, UK has invested over \$15 million directly and adopted university construction standards to include physical security requirements for all new construction and renovations This past summer, UK and UK HealthCare officials added security measures in response to increasing reports of violence taking place across the nation in healthcare settings, including a plan to invest more than \$5 million in security enhancements Investing in the ability to lock down classrooms across campus Residence halls have access control on perimeter doors and individual suites Installed emergency buttons in high-risk areas UKPD has over 3,000 cameras throughout campus to provide situational awareness Emergency Blue Towers strategically placed around campus Installed metal detectors in areas of UK HealthCare UKPD operates the Central KY Information and Threat Analysis Center (CITAC), which works in partnership with the FBI and Secret Service's National Threat Analysis Center UK Crosswalk Task Force evaluating different solutions to enhance pedestrian safety LiveSafe App: silently communicate with UKPD Transportation: use Kentucky Wildcab for a free, late night on-demand transportation option that operates both on and off campus Active Aggressor Response Training UKPD: 859-257-8573 (UKPD) or call 911 if you cannot reach them STAR program is still active, and it is a program for women that helps women learn techniques to fight back if they are in a dangerous situation
